





Significant policy instruments for GPP in Germany



- no national level scheme / no NAP for GPP
- Mandatory criteria for wood, energy efficient products and services on federal level.
- Mandatory use of LCC in procurement procedures.
- Procurement guidance for several product groups based on criteria of the ecolabel Blue Angel.

Significant initiatives for innovative GPP in Germany



- National Climate Initiative funding for climate friendly investment in public facilities
- German Procurement Agency, KOINNO and various municipalities:
 - new organisational understanding, structures and networks
 - Energy efficiency (lighting)
 - PCP and PPI in E-mobility concepts, road construction, energy supply & storage

Current challenges in tendering eco-innovative solutions

less than half of the innovations presented at KOINNO address more environmentally sound solutions

Main focus:

- Economic growth, wealth and innov. leadership
- Change in understanding and infrastructure: mainstreaming IT-infrastructure, ePocurement, eHealth

Hamburg recycled asphalt; integrative e-mobility strategy

Kreis Coesfeld biogas from domestic food waste

→ delivering heat to 1400 households

Friedberg/ Frankfurt region street lighting with motion sensors
